Reflecting upon 2012 brings thoughts of quality early care and education! The 4-C team worked hard to continue and improve upon the already existing programs serving our communities' children.

Through integrated support and expertise, the Professional Development program provided training opportunities for hundreds of early care and education professionals; in which the ultimate beneficiaries were thousands of children throughout southern Wisconsin. The Certification program and Child and Adult Care Food Program continued to conduct home visits for family early care and education professionals to ensure safety and nutrition standards were being met.

The Referral program assisted over 2,700 families find child care for their children. These families were better equipped to go to work or school with confidence, as they obtained information on how to identify quality in early childhood settings.

4-C continued to advocate for Wisconsin's children and published wage and rate reports for Columbia, Dane, Dodge, Green, Jefferson, Sauk, Rock, and Walworth counties that assist the early care and education community, and many others, in making critical decisions to support their overall business. Similarly, 4-C continued to conduct technical assistance regarding early care and education to families, group center and family care professionals, community organizations, school districts, and legislative representatives.

We continue to work hard in support of the 4-C mission, which ensures every child has access to high quality early care and education, and we look forward to continuing our mission's work into next year!

4-C PROGRAMS

REFERRAL

- Helped 2,735 families find child care
- Provided child care related technical assistance to 11,810 families
- Served 11 families and 11 children through the AODA Child Care Program
- Provided 11 enhanced referrals to parents from seven local companies



CERTIFICATION

- Conducted 11 start-up meetings for 188 total potential English-Speaking child care providers and 7 start-up meetings for 25 potential Spanish-speaking providers
- Conducted 476 home visits to certified family child care homes
- Consulted with 2,184 parents and child care providers
- Latino Child Care Project: 13 workshops/ classes were offered in Spanish with 92 persons attending

CACFP

- Helped to provide nutritious meals and snacks to an average of 4,750 children per month
- Reimbursed an average of 498 child care providers per month
- Conducted 1,265 home visits to monitor the program and offer nutrition education and training
- Contributed over \$2 million to the southern Wisconsin economy through child care provider reimbursements



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Offered 146 training opportunities to 2,560 attendees
- Impacted 453 early childhood professionals through the collaborative Launching Into Literacy & Math series
- Provides access to the Resource Room & Lending Library to providers 377 times
- Worked with 426 child care programs in preparing for the YoungStar quality rating system
